Heads Message

Our initial burst of Covid cases was over fairly quickly and our staff continue to take hygiene very seriously. Please do remember that you should not send your son/daughter to school if they have any of the three symptoms;

A new continuous cough

A high temperature

A loss of smell or taste.

We are all working hard to stop any spread in school testing regularly. If your son/daughter does have any of the three symptoms, please get a PCR test – they are coming back within 24 hours if you visit a testing site or 72 hours if you take a postal test.

In school it has been so lovely starting to get back to normal although very slowly! We now have half of the school joining in assemblies and lunches in the hall and lots of our groups have started.

The I base is running sessions in book club, journalism, reading, maths and strength building activities. We have Physio and hydrotherapy running at full capacity and advanced maths and English groups are up and running too. Students are enjoying educational visits to Beckenham Place Park, Downham leisure centre for trampoline sessions and to Brockley Rise every week. Key stage 5 are enjoying a return to options groups and Lunch club. It is fantastic to see our school full of life and busy again. Of course we still continue to reduce contacts across Key stages and remember to wash hands and be safe!

We also have some other exciting news – last week the Variety Club donated a brand new Sunshine coach to our school which will be a fantastic asset when we increase our enrichment activities back to full capacity. We also bought a new 9 seater car which will enable us to continue to make our visits but will not have an impact on the environment.

Lastly a quick building update. The new school is growing all the time but has slowed a little due to the difficulties of obtaining some materials. We might have to review our moving plans but at present the predicted finish date is April next year. We will be organising workshops and information sessions to tell you more about this exciting new venture as soon as we have clear information to share.

Have a lovely half term and we look forward to seeing all of our young people back on November 1st ready for our Christmas half term. We already have lots of Christmas activities planned!

POSITIVE COVID RESULTS

- Either by ringing the school and selecting option 2 -Reporting a Positive Covid case. You can leave a message there.
- Or you can email <u>Schoolcontact@greenvaleschool.co.uk</u> and inform us. You need to let us know the following.
 - * Name and Date of birth.
 - * First day of symptoms.
 - * Last day in school.
 - * Date of test.
 - * Date of conformation the test is positive.

Free School Meals
