Hello Everyone,

We would all like to say a big thank you for all of your amazing ongoing support this term. So many parents have been very complimentary about our home learning offer and I know that our staff love an opportunity to interact with students even if only on a Zoom. We miss seeing everyone in school.

In school we continue to work hard to keep our students and staff safe. In combination with Passenger Services staff we are seeing approximately one positive case every week. We appreciate how hard the isolation periods are but thank you for contributing to keeping everyone safe. Just to remind all parents that if your son / daughter is required to isolate you MUST be able to collect them from school as soon as possible after you are notified. We are no longer able to bring young people home if they need to isolate.

I hope you are engaging with the on-line learning. Please remember that al participants must always be fully dressed and that background activities and conversations are being shared with others so please restrict these when your young person is on-line. There is a lovely Maths treasure hunt which I am sure you can enjoy together alongside videos on Road Safety, Music, Dance and Careers. Our staff are amazingly talented and have produced these lovely resources—I hope you are able to enjoy them!

Next week will be half term and we are looking forward to a change of routine. We hope that shortly after half term we will be informed by the Government of the plans for reopening schools. As soon as we know we will call you to discuss your son / daughter. We will continue to work closely with your wishes regarding safety and any potential return to school.

### **POSITIVE COVID RESULTS**

As I am sure you are aware schools have to continue to support the contact tracing. Thus if your son / daughter becomes unwell and tests positive for the virus then you should notify the school even if this is during the half-term.

You can do this by

- Either by ringing the school and selecting option 2 -Reporting a Positive Covid case. You can leave a message there.
- Or you can email <u>Schoolcontact@greenvaleschool.co.uk</u> and inform us. You need to let us know the following.
  - \* Name and Date of birth.
  - \* First day of symptoms.
  - \* Last day in school.
  - \* Date of test.
  - \* Date of conformation the test is positive.

### Free School Meals

If your circumstances have changed or you think you might be eligible and if you get certain welfare benefits, you can apply for free school meals for your child.

This took Harish a little bit of time to understand and to build his new routines but though lots of amazing support by Harish's mum lessons now are much more successful. He is now listening better during the online sessions and he can engage in the lessons more. Harish consistently puts in effort to do his best and has overcome lots of barriers to his learning this year and that is why we think he should receive the Jack Petchey Award."
