Heads Message

The first half term of this year has passed so quickly! Our new students have settled in really well and already feel like they have always been here.

Over the summer lots of work has taken place in school including the installation of three extra rooms to the side of our site. These will allow us to expand in numbers gradually before the new sixth form site is available. The new rooms are working very well and our Key stage 5 students are enjoying being in their own area and have already planted pots of herbs and flowers for the decking veranda!

The expansion plans continue to move along. The build will start on the Mayow Road site next summer with a view to opening in September 2020. On the new site there will be provision for our post 16 students and some of our Glade Pathway students. It is a really exciting opportunity to design a new building for Key stage 5 students and the location is perfect for accessing the local community.

All of our young people are on one of our Pathways as you will have noticed in the information and reports you received last year. This is working really well and was highly praised by Ofsted. It ensures that every student receives personalised and appropriate provision. Here is a reminder of our four pathways;

Greenvale Pathways.

Grove Pathway

For students with Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (PMLD). Students work below P4.

Forest Pathway

For students with Learning Difficulties working within P4-P8.

Woodland Pathway

For students with Learning Difficulties working above P levels and working towards Entry Level Qualifications.

Glade Pathway

For students with Learning Difficulties and additional complex needs. Students typically work from P2ii-P7 and require a high level of structure and routine throughout the day.

Thank you to all the parents who came to our Parents Evening and Information Fair in September. It is always a great opportunity to share information and also to meet other professionals.
