Some activities such as hydro and group physio that require close contact or regular mixing of classes will be temporarily suspended. Staff will undertake LFT tests when in school twice a week. Any staff testing positive will leave the school premises immediately and have a PCR test. The bubble will then isolate. LFDs are now being carried out at home. During Lockdown student and staff numbers in the building are reduced.		

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			Rooms have capacity notices so that they do not become overcrowded. If necessary when buses are full they will be unloaded two at a time to ensure the corridors are not crowded. 80+% Staff are taking part in twice weekly Lateral Flow Device tests. Any positive results are acted upon immediately and close contacts are asked to isolate for 10 days. 80+%staff have received their first Covid vaccination and many students have received their first dose.
