Food allergies

We will only be sending food home with a food label, or a list of ingredients, to ensure we protect those with allergies. The 14 allergens are: **celery, cereals containing gluten (such as barley and oats), crustaceans (such as prawns, crabs and lobsters), eggs, fish, lupin, milk, molluscs** (such as mussels and oysters), mustard, peanuts, sesame, soybeans, sulphur dioxide and sulphites. Please can you also make sure you only send in food to share (e.g. birthday cake) with a clear label and list of ingredients. Thank you

REMINDER POSITIVE COVID RESULTS

- Either by ringing the school and selecting option 2 -Reporting a Positive Covid case. You can leave a message there.
- Or you can email <u>Schoolcontact@greenvaleschool.co.uk</u> and inform us. You need to let us know the following.
 - * Name and Date of birth.
 - * First day of symptoms.
 - * Last day in school.
 - * Date of test.
 - * Date of conformation the test is positive.
