Students from KS3, KS4 and High Needs were able to identify and recognize different jobs in the community such as a doctor, a nurse, a dentist, a cleaner, a hairdresser, a chef, a shop assistant, a lollipop man and a mechanic by dressing up in costumes and role-playing in class. After recognizing jobs and careers in the community, students had the First Aid workshop to be able to understand the importance of first aid in school and who they should ask for help in case they need it. At the end of the workshop, students received a certificate.







KS5 students worked on the same topic but they preferred to open a business. They opened a coffee shop! Students were able to set up the tables, setting the price for food, taking orders, working with money, cleaning and at the end they enjoyed eating a variety of ingredients like scones with clotted cream and jam, satsumas, bananas, raisins, juice, tea, coffee and hot chocolate. Students loved the idea of working in a coffee shop.




Felt Workshop

The biggest achievement for Enzo is that he is now able to travel around the school sensibly, and is now even being encouraged to do jobs such as deliver letters, collect the hoist or sheets from the printer with a staff member. He is now also trialling joining his peers in the main KS3/4 playground. Being able to travel around the school sensibly, we feel is a massive achievement for Enzo, and a change that brings him more independence and opportunities to continue to mature and improve.  - * Name and Date of birth.
 - * First day of symptoms.
 - * Last day in school.
 - * Date of test.
 - * Date of conformation the test is positive.

Free School Meals
